Ms. McLoughlin presented this item to the Board. She shared that the item was developed in response to input from stakeholders at the September 2022 SBEC meeting regarding challenges with the SBEC's current rules related to test exemptions for persons with hearing impairments. She reviewed the proposed amendments to the rule and shared that the proposed changes had been informed by stakeholder feedback. She shared that 15 public comments had been submitted on the item and provided a summary of the input, including the additional amendment informed by public comment to clarify that candidates be unable to process "auditory linguistic information" to qualify for an exemption from the Science of Teaching Reading certification exam.

Ms. Sandlin introduced Dr. Jonathan Schwartz and Dr. Diane Miller, representatives from the University of Houston-Downtown, to answer questions from the Board and provide a brief overview of their application. Dr. Schwartz and Dr. Miller shared that if approved, the University of Houston-Downtown would continue their strong service to support high-poverty, diverse schools and would have an opportunity to increase recruitment of principals as pursuing that certification would be a natural progression from their undergraduate program. Several SBEC members expressed congratulations and asked questions that allowed Dr. Schwartz and Dr. Miller to further highlight the unique offerings of their program and their plans for success in the new area of certification. Once all questions were answered, the Board voted on this item.

# 19. Discussion of Proposed Repeal of 19 TAC Chapter 228, Requirements for Educator Preparation Programs, and New 19 TAC Chapter 228, Requirements for Educator Preparation Programs

Ms. Moriaty and Ms. Ayers presented this item to the Board. Ms. Moriaty highlighted the goals for the redesign of Chapter 228 were grounded in improving readability and ease of reference, clarifying areas that have caused confusion in the past, improving enforceability of existing provisions, and implementing legislation. Ms. Moriaty shared that the intensive pre-service option created in 2019, has to date not been utilized by candidates. Ms. Moriaty and Ms. Ayers responded to the Board's questions about intensive pre-service and confirmed that additional stakeholder feedback regarding this option would be gathered to share with the Board in April. Ms. Moriaty and Ms. Ayers responded to the Board's questions regarding the definition for "authentic school setting" for field-based experiences and stated that additional stakeholder feedback would also be gathered regarding this definition and other proposed changes to improve the current rules.
