

### School Safety Allotment Survey (HB1525, Section 31)

The sixth pillar of the SSSP requires team members to support facility safety and security. In addition, the 86th Legislature passed Senate Bill (SB) 11, which created an annual school safety allotment to help fund equipment, programs and training related to school safety and security. More recently, the 87th Legislature enacted House Bill (HB) 1525 that included a
