College Board providessourse descriptions at outline the course content, describe the curricular goals of the subject, and provide sample at icom questions (College Board, 209c). Course descriptions for new courses are typicately geloped over a two three year period (College Board 2019b). The College Board evaluates and revises AP courses examinations regularly.

The College Board requishigh schools to submit Albourse addit materials to request authorization to assign the "AP" designation to advancedrees (College Board, 209c). AP course addit materials include a subject pecific audit form and a course syllabus from each teacher who is planning to teach proposed AP course. For courses to receive the AP designation from the College Board, curricula must meet or exceed expectations established by an external college favility erfor corresponding collegelevel courses. After receiving initial authorization from the College Board to offer a specific AP-designated course, schools not need to resubmit orse addit materials in subsequent years unless the teacher of the course hanges, requirements for the course are revised, or a new AP course is added (College Board, 2019g)

Examination questions are developed by a team of senior examiners f, landaexternal consultants (IBO, 2018). After questions are eviewed for attributes such as course content coverage and lack of bias, theorem sent to external advisors foodependent review he examinations at the translated into French and Spanish, reviewed for translation accuracy, and delivered to schools. For openended and normal tiple-choice items, detailed scoring criteria are provided to examiners so the items can be scored as objectively as possible. Examination scores range from 1 (lowest) to 7 (highest)

Most diploma candidates complete all six subjetctup assessments in May at the end of the two year program, but some choose to take one or two examinations at the end of their first year.
